

COVID-19 Update: 14th April

In this evening's COVID-19 update from Cardiff Council: extending the Free School Meals voucher scheme for another two weeks; Cardiff Council office workers redeployed to homeless service save a life; the Council offers free training to become qualified care workers; and Cardiff's parks 'quieter than normal' despite bank holiday sunshine.

Free School Meal provision – voucher scheme extended

Today, Cardiff Council has again sent Free School Meal vouchers in the post to all eligible families, providing funds for a further two weeks of provision. Each voucher has a value of £40, per child.

The Council issued two weeks' worth of vouchers before the Easter school holidays, so this latest mailing extends the voucher scheme to four weeks for the time being.

Cardiff Council office workers redeployed to homeless service save a life

A homeless man's life was saved by two redeployed Cardiff Council officers who rushed to give first aid when the man collapsed and stopped breathing.

Both officers had temporarily volunteered to take up posts with the Hostels and Outreach team as part of the council's redeployment project to ensure frontline services continue to operate in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Val Broomfield and Ashley Evans redeployed from office-based roles with the Legal Department and the Tenancy Sustainment Team only three weeks ago. They quickly administered CPR, which revived the man.

Cardiff's parks 'quieter than normal' despite bank holiday sunshine

Cardiff's parks were generally quiet this weekend with the majority of people observing social distancing requirements.

Cabinet Member for Culture and Leisure, Cllr Peter Bradbury said: "The message to stay home, stay safe seems to have been heeded by the majority of people this weekend.

"With sunny weather and high temperatures like we've had over the bank holiday weekend, Cardiff's parks would normally be full of people, but our parks staff, who have been out on patrol with the Police every day, supported by loud hailer messages broadcast by the Coastguard, have been reporting that parks were much quieter than normal and that most people were following social distancing requirements."

“I’d like to offer my thanks to all our residents – those who resisted the sunshine and stayed at home and those who took their daily exercise in our parks, but did so in a responsible manner.”
