

COVID-19 Update: 27th May

Here is the latest COVID-19 update from Cardiff Council, covering: the latest on Bessemer Close Recycling Centre, and a reminder that you can also book now to use Lamby Way from Sunday 31st May; providing thousands of devices to tackle digital deprivation; temporary car park closure at Parc Cefn Onn; and Cardiff Libraries, your go-to for free lockdown reads and more.

Update on recycling centres in Cardiff

Bessemer Close Recycling Centre re-opened on an appointment only basis on Tuesday May 26th. In the last two days, 640 residents have used this site by making an appointment through the online booking system.

The average time for a resident to get into the recycling centre, dispose of their recycling and leave the site is approximately 15 minutes. This compares favourably with other parts of Wales, with reported waiting times of up to four hours in other areas.

Lamby Way Recycling Centre is due to re-open on Sunday March 31st but access will only be permitted if residents make an appointment.

The only items that can be brought to the recycling centres for now are cardboard, wood, garden waste, scrap metal, small electrical items and hard plastic.

Since the online booking system was launched at lunchtime last Friday, 4,300 bookings have been made at both of the recycling centres. 2,345 bookings have been made for Bessemer Close and 1,955 bookings have been made for Lamby Way.

To ensure social distancing rules can be maintained, certain waste types currently cannot be brought to these facilities. The opening times for both recycling centres are from 8.30am until 4.30pm seven days a week. Residents can only book an appointment online through the council website: www.cardiff.gov.uk/recyclingcentres . Anyone who turns up without an appointment will not be allowed to access the sites.

Providing thousands of devices to tackle digital deprivation

Cardiff Council is providing thousands of digital devices and broadband dongles via Welsh Government's Education Technology Project Fund to support children in Cardiff that have been unable to access online learning during school closures caused by COVID-19.

The Council has worked closely with schools across the city to deliver the scheme, which will see over 5000 Chromebook or i-Pad devices repurposed from existing schools or purchased, and 2500 broadband dongles have been ordered.

Cabinet Member for Education, Employment and Skills, Cllr Sarah Merry said: "Cardiff Council has developed a range of ways to address the issue of digital deprivation so that children and young people can continue to access online learning during school closures.

"We have been gathering information to determine exactly how many pupils require digital support and a dedicated project team has been established to deliver the new scheme with the help of our schools.

"Importantly, as well as ensuring children and young people can continue to learn and engage with education during the health crisis, we also intend for this to be part of a long term solution to support distance learning following the lockdown."

Temporary car park closure at Parc Cefn Onn



Please note that the car park at Parc Cefn Onn is currently closed due to roadworks taking place on Cherry Orchard Road.

The car park will reopen Friday 29th May with limited parking available during the summer due to the ongoing refurbishment to the toilet building.

The park remains open.

Dyma'r diweddaraſ ar COVID-19 gan Gyngor Caerdydd: y diweddaraſ ar Ganolfan Ailgylchu Bessemer Close, a nodyn i'ch atgoffa y gallwch hefyd drefnu apwyntiad ar gyfer Ffordd Lamby o ddydd Sul 31 Mai; Caerdydd yn mynd i'r afael ag amddifadedd digidol; maes parcio ym Mharc Cefn Onn; a Llyfrgelloedd Caerdydd, deunydd darllen a gweithgareddau.

Diweddariad ar ganolfannau ailgylchu yng Nghaerdydd

Ail-agorodd Canolfan Ailgylchu Bessemer Close ar sail apwyntiad yn unig ddydd Mawrth, 26 Mai. Dros y ddeuddydd diwethaf, mae 640 o breswylwyr wedi defnyddio'r safle hwn ar ôl gwneud apwyntiadau drwy'r system archebu ar-lein.

Yr amser cyfartalog i breswlydd fynd i mewn i'r ganolfan ailgylchu, gwaredu ei ailgylchu a gadael y safle yw tua 15 munud. Mae hyn yn cymharu'n ffafriol â rhannau eraill o Gymru, gydag amseroedd aros o hyd at bedair awr i fynd i mewn i gyfleuster mewn rhai mannau yn ôl y sôn.

Bydd Canolfan Ailgylchu Ffordd Lamby yn ailagor ddydd Sul, 31 Mai, ond caniateir mynediad ddim ond os yw preswylwyr yn gwneud apwyntiad.

Yr unig eitemau y gellir eu cyflwyno i'r canolfannau ailgylchu am y tro yw cardfwrdd, pren, gwastraff gardd, metel sgrap, eitemau trydanol bach a phlastigau caled.

Ers lansio'r system archebu ar-lein, amser cinio dydd Gwener diwethaf, mae 4,300 a apwyntiadau wedi eu harchebu yn y ddwy ganolfan ailgylchu. Mae 2,345 apwyntiad wedi'u trefnu ar gyfer Bessemer Close a 1,955 ar gyfer Ffordd Lamby.

Er mwyn sicrhau y gellir cadw at reolau ymbellhau cymdeithasol, ni chewch ddod â mathau penodol o wastraff i'r cyfleusterau hyn. Caerdydd yn mynd i'r afael ag amddifadedd digidol

Mae Cyngor Caerdydd yn darparu miloedd o ddyfeisiau digidol a donglau band eang drwy Gronfa Prosiect Technoleg Addysg Llywodraeth Cymru i gefnogi plant yng Nghaerdydd sydd wedi methu â dysgu ar-lein tra bod ysgolion ar gau oherwydd COVID-19.

Mae'r Cyngor wedi gweithio'n agos gydag ysgolion ar draws y ddinas i gyflawni'r cynllun, a fydd yn gweld dros 5000 o ddyfeisiau Chromebook neu i-Pad yn cael eu benthg gan ysgolion sy'n bodoli eisoes neu eu prynu, a 2500 o ddonglau band eang yn cael eu harchebu.

Dyweddodd yr Aelod Cabinet dros Addysg, Cyflogaeth a Sgiliau, y Cynghorydd Sarah Merry: "Mae Cyngor Caerdydd wedi datblygu amrywiaeth o ffyrdd o fynd i'r afael ag amddifadedd digidol, er mwyn i blant a phobl ifanc barhau i fanteisio ar ddysgu ar-lein, tra bod ysgolion ar gau.

"Rydym wedi bod yn casglu gwybodaeth i bennu faint yn union o ddisgyblion sydd angen cymorth digidol ac mae tîm prosiect penodol wedi'i sefydlu i gyflwyno'r cynllun newydd gyda chymorth ein hysgolion.

"Yn bwysig, yn ogystal â sicrhau bod plant a phobl ifanc yn gallu parhau i ddysgu ac ymgysylltu ag addysg yn ystod yr argyfwng iechyd, rydym hefyd yn bwriadu i hyn fod yn rhan o ateb hirdymor i gefnogi dysgu o bell ar ôl y cloi mawr."
