

### **COVID-19 Update: 3<sup>rd</sup> July**

Welcome to the last COVID-19 update of the week from Cardiff Council, covering: reminding people that littering is not acceptable; schools receive positive feedback after first week of reopening; and our Cleansing Team's generous donation to the NHS, which turns 72 on Sunday.

### **Cardiff Council is reminding people that littering is not acceptable**

From Monday, we will see a significant change in lockdown rules as the 'stay local' rule is lifted.

With many people still furloughed or working from home and with more non-essential shops open, Cardiff is set to welcome an increased number of visitors to the city to make the most of the new rules after weeks of restrictions.

However, we want to remind all visitors that Cardiff does not tolerate littering.

People must take responsibility for their own waste. If the litter bin is full, please take your litter home with you to dispose of correctly.

Our advice is:

- Find a bin for your litter if you're in a public place
- Take your rubbish home if you can't find a bin or if the bin is full
- BBQs in public spaces aren't currently advised by the Government, but our advice pre-lockdown was that they should be left on the concrete, near to bins for collection. They shouldn't be left on the grass or placed inside bins as this is a fire hazard

The pandemic is not over and the council is using the resources available to us to ensure we can deliver the best possible services for the residents of Cardiff.

Please remember to take your litter home with you or dispose of it correctly. You could face a fine of £100 for littering.

### **'Thrilled to be back and smiles all around'; Cardiff schools receive positive feedback after first week of reopening**

Schools from across Cardiff have been praised this week as they reopened their doors to welcome pupils back to the classroom for the first time since March.

Every one of Cardiff's primary, secondary and special schools reopened from Monday 29, June so that children and young people could 'check in, catch up and prepare', the approach set out by Welsh Government.

With social distancing measures in place including a third of pupils in at any one time and staggered start and finish times, schools looked different, but feedback has been that children couldn't wait to get back again and Headteachers and their staff were delighted for their return.

To help assist parents and pupils returning to school, a series of Frequently Asked Questions has been published on the Council's website, providing answers on a range of topics, including health and safety, the curriculum and childcare.

They have had fun filled days with their friends, explored their emotions through natural art, created a reflective lockdown branch, revised ICT skills to support their home learning and finished with a relaxing art session. It was lovely to see the children leaving school with huge smiles on their faces and looking forward to returning next week!"

**Francesca Williams, parent at Hywel Dda Primary School said:** "Fantastic first day back in school. The school were highly organised and very efficient. My daughter thoroughly enjoyed herself and can't wait for next week. A great transition to normality."
