

COVID-19 Update: 6th April

This evening's update covers the latest on support for businesses, a reminder that waste will be collected on the Good Friday and Easter Monday bank holidays, additional hub schools, and how the Council and the Police joined forces to patrol Cardiff's parks.

Over £35 million of grant aid delivered to local businesses in Cardiff

More than £35m has now been distributed to Cardiff businesses in grant aid by Cardiff Council as part of the on-going COVID-19 rescue package.

Since the £1.4bn financial rescue package was announced the council has processed 2,590 applications in just under a week on behalf of Welsh Government.

Applications are continuing to flood in and the authority is assessing them as quickly as possible to ensure that vital funds can be distributed to eligible businesses that are in need of assistance.

The distribution of this grant aid follows the announcement from Welsh Government that all retail, leisure and hospitality businesses with a rateable value of £500,000 or less will receive 100% non-domestic rates relief for 2020-21.

This will be administered automatically through the Council's Rate Scheme and will apply automatically so eligible businesses do not need to make any representations to the Council.

In addition to the business rate relief which is available, a number of grants are available for businesses which have been directly affected by the crisis.

Easter Waste and Recycling Collections

Your collection day will remain the same during Easter this year, but collection times may change so please ensure your waste is out by 6am.

Waste collection services will operate on both Good Friday (10 April) and Easter Monday (13 April).

Our refuse collectors will work across the Easter bank holidays to ensure the collection service continues.

Recycling

We're asking that you continue to separate recyclable materials, just as you normally would, as we recognise that there would be no space in your black bin / red striped bags for these items if you didn't have a recycling bag collection.

Cardiff wants to become the best recycling city in the world, so we want you to continue to use your green recycling bags to keep up good habits for when the crisis is over.

The following items can go in your green recycling bag:

- ✓ Cardboard Easter egg boxes
- ✓ Plastic packaging from Easter egg boxes
- ✓ Foil (please make sure that it is clean and scrunched up in a ball)

Additional hub schools opened this week

Today, an extra four hub schools opened to provide child care for key workers, bringing the total number of schools to 20.

Peter Lea Primary School, Rhydypennau Primary School, and Ysgol y Wern have been opened in order to bring additional capacity to the system. This has allowed pupil numbers to be more evenly distributed across all the hubs, further strengthening the schools' arrangements for social distancing.

The fourth addition hub school to open today is Bryn y Deryn. This is providing extra support for vulnerable young people at Key Stage 4.

Cardiff Council initially implemented the school hub system on Monday, 30th March, in response to the restrictions on movement and social gatherings introduced by UK Government and Welsh Government.

Since then, over 800 children and young people have been registered to receive child care, with around 200 going to a hub school each day, on average.

The hubs are being staffed by a daily team of over 130 volunteer teachers, teaching assistants and other support staff, helping to deliver over 12000 hours of childcare a week.

In addition, over 200 pre-school aged children are being cared for by registered private, voluntary and independent childcare providers across the city.

Dros £35 miliwn o gymorth grant wedi ei ddsbarthu i fusnesau lleol yng Nghaerdydd

Mae dros £35 miliwn bellach wedi'i ddsbarthu i fusnesau Caerdydd mewn cymorth grant gan Gyngor Caerdydd fel rhan o'r pecyn achub COVID-19 parhaus.

Ers cyhoeddi'r pecyn achub ariannol gwerth £1.4 biliwn mae'r cyngor wedi prosesu 2,590 o geisiadau o fewn ychydig o dan wythnos ar ran Llywodraeth Cymru.

Mae ceisiadau'n parhau i lifo i mewn ac mae'r awdurdod yn eu hasesu mor gyflym â phosibl er mwyn sicrhau y gall arian hanfodol gael ei ddsbarthu i fusnesau cymwys y mae angen cymorth arnynt.

Mae ddsbarthu'r cymorth grant hwn yn dilyn y cyhoeddiad gan Lywodraeth Cymru y bydd pob busnes manwerthu, hamdden a lletygarwch sydd â gwerth ardrethol o £500,000 neu lai yn derbyn rhyddhad rhag 100% o'r ardrethi annomestig ar gyfer 2020.

Caiff hwn ei weinyddu'n awtomatig trwy Gynllun Ardrethi'r Cyngor a bydd yn cael ei gymhwysu'n awtomatig felly nid oes angen i fusnesau cymwys wneud unrhyw sylwadau i'r Cyngor.

Yn ogystal â'r rhyddhad rhag ardrethi busnes sydd ar gael, mae nifer o grantiau ar gael i fusnesau y mae'r argyfwng yn effeithio'n uniongyrchol arnynt.

Ysgolion Hyb ychwanegol ar agor yr wythnos hon

Heddiw, agorwyd pedair ysgol hyb ychwanegol i gynnig gofal plant i weithwyr allweddol, gan ddod y nifer o ysgolion i 16.

Mae Ysgol Gynradd Peter Lea, Ysgol Gynradd Rhydypennau ac ysgol y Wern wedi eu hagor er mwyn sicrhau rhagor o gapasiti i'r system. Mae hyn wedi ei gwneud yn bosib dosbarthu nifer y disgyblion yn fwy cyfartal rhwng yr hybiau i gyd, yn cryfhau ymhellach drefniadau'r ysgolion ar gyfer ymbellhau cymdeithasol.

Y bedwaredd ysgol hyb i agor yn ychwanegol heddiw yw Bryn y Deryn. Mae hon yn cynnig cymorth ychwanegol i bobl ifanc sy'n agored i niwed ym Cyfnod Allweddol 4.

Rhoddodd Cyngor Caerdydd y system hybiau ysgolion ar waith ddydd Llun, 30 Mawrth, mewn ymateb i'r cyfyngiadau ar symud a digwyddiadau cymdeithasol a gyflwynwyd gan Lywodraeth y DU a Llywodraeth Cymru.

Ers hynny, mae dros 800 o blant a phobl ifanc wedi'u cofrestru i dderbyn gofal plant, gyda thua 200 yn mynd i ysgol hyb bob dydd, ar gyfartaledd.

Mae'r hybiau'n cael eu staffio gan dîm o 130 o athrawon, cynorthwywyr addysgu a staff cymorth eraill sy'n wirfoddolwyr, yn helpu i gyflwyno 12,000 awr o ofal plant yr wythnos.

Yn ogystal, mae dros 200 o blant cyn oed ysgol yn derbyn gofal gan ddarparwyr gofal plant preifat, gwirfoddol ac annibynnol ledled y ddinas.
