

Cardiff Council Update: 9th July

Here is tonight's update from Cardiff Council, covering: reaction to Welsh Government's announcement on school provision from September; outdoor event spaces could be used by businesses looking for socially distanced premises; and a huge thanks to our Litter Champions taking on the Litter Louts.

Reaction to Welsh Government's announcement on school provision from September

Welsh Government Education Minister, Kirsty Williams, confirmed today that all pupils will be able to return to school in September.

Cabinet Member for Education, Employment and Skills, Cllr Sarah Merry, said: "Many children and parents across Wales will welcome today's announcement from Welsh Government that all children should return to the classroom, full time from September.

"Over the last few months, an incredible amount of work has been undertaken by our schools to provide learning from home, facilitated by the local authority and our partners. But inevitably, being away from the classroom has meant that children and young people have been missing out. Returning to school is very important for their education, wellbeing and development, however, I know some families will be feeling anxious about this news.

"Ensuring that a full return is managed safely is a priority, and the health and safety of pupils and staff comes first. Cardiff Council will be following Welsh Government guidance and will be working closely with schools to overcome any challenges so that they can welcome pupils back to a safe learning environment next term."

The Minister announced that:

- Schools will return to full capacity, with only limited social distancing within contact groups.
- At full operations, a contact group should consist of around 30 children. Some direct or indirect mixing between children in different contact groups will also be unavoidable, such as on transport, receiving specialist teaching or due to staffing constraints.
- Social distancing for adults should remain in line with regulations and guidance.
- Schools will be required to minimise the risk of transmission by taking other mitigating measures using the hierarchy of risk controls.
- Every school should continue to be "Covid Protected" - having carried out risk assessments and mitigated them with a combination of controls such as hand and surface hygiene, one-way systems and so forth.
- If early warning information shows a local incident or outbreak then nearby schools should implement appropriate restriction measures.
- Each school will be provided with a supply of home testing kits.

Cardiff outdoor event spaces could be used by businesses that are looking for socially distanced premises

Zumba classes in Bute Park, kettle bells on the lawn at Sophia Gardens or choir practice on the Barrage could all be part of your post-lockdown summer - if plans go ahead to open up some of Cardiff's prime outdoor event spaces to local businesses experiencing issues operating in their normal indoor premises, due to Covid-19.

Cardiff Council has launched a survey today, asking for expressions of interest from local businesses that could be interested in hiring sites in prime city locations including Bute Park, Sophia Gardens and Cardiff Bay.

Cabinet Member for Culture and Leisure, Cllr Peter Bradbury said: "As lockdown restrictions ease we're determined to do everything we can to support the local economy and, provided it's possible for the businesses to operate safely, in line with current Coronavirus rules, this could be a really interesting opportunity for some businesses to restart or expand their offering."

The survey suggests that businesses in the health, fitness and performing arts sectors may be particularly interested in the opportunity but welcomes interest from businesses in all areas of the economy provided the activity is covered by current or pre-announced changes to Welsh Government Coronavirus regulations and can be adapted to an outdoor environment.

Ymateb i gyhoeddiad Llywodraeth Cymru ar ddarpariaeth ysgol o fis Medi

Dywedodd y Cynghorydd Sarah Merry, yr Aelod Cabinet dros Addysg, Cyflogaeth a Sgiliau: "Bydd nifer o blant a rhieni ledled Cymru yn croesawu cyhoeddiad heddiw gan Llywodraeth Cymru y bydd yr holl blant yn dychwelyd i'r ystafell ddosbarth, yn llawn amser o fis Medi.

"Dros y misoedd diwethaf, mae llawer o waith wedi'i wneud gan ein hysgolion i gynnig dysgu o gartref, wedi'i hwyluso gan yr awdurdod lleol a'n partneriaid. Ond yn anochel felly, mae bod i ffwrdd o'r ystafell ddosbarth wedi golygu bod plant a phobl ifanc wedi bod ar eu colled. Mae dychwelyd i'r ysgol yn bwysig iawn ar gyfer eu haddysg, lles a datblygiad, ond, gwn fod rhai teuluoedd yn teimlo'n bryderus am y newyddion yma.

"Mae sicrhau bod y broses dychwelyd yn llawn yn cael ei rheoli'n ddiogel a iechyd a diogelwch disgyblion a staff yn flaenoriaeth. Bydd Cyngor Caerdydd yn dilyn canllawiau Llywodraeth Cymru ac yn gweithio'n agos ag ysgolion i oresgyn unrhyw

heriau fel y gallant groesawu disgyblion yn ôl i amgylchedd dysgu diogel y tymor nesaf.”

Cyhoeddodd y, Kirsty Williams, gweinidog y canlynol:

- Bydd ysgolion yn dychwelyd i gapasiti llawn gydag elfen gyfyngedig yn unig o gadw pellter cymdeithasol oddi mewn i grwpiau cyswllt.
- Wrth weithredu'n llawn, dylai grŵp cyswllt gynnwys tua 30 o blant. Bydd rhywfaint o gymysgu uniongyrchol ac anuniongyrchol rhwng plant mewn gwahanol grwpiau cyswllt hefyd yn amhosibl ei osgoi, fel ar gludiant, wrth dderbyn addysg arbenigol neu oherwydd cyfyngiadau staffio.
- Dylai pob ysgol barhau i fod yn “Ddiogel Rhag Covid” – wedi cynnal asesiadau risg a lliniaru unrhyw risg gyda chyfuniad o fesurau rheoli fel hylendid dwylo ac arwynebau, systemau un ffordd ac ati.
- Os yw gwybodaeth rybuddio gynnar yn dangos digwyddiad neu achosion lleol, dylai'r ysgolion cyfagos weithredu mesurau cyfyngu priodol.
- Bydd cyflenwad o becynnau profi cartref ar gael ym mhob ysgol.

Mae Cyngor Caerdydd wedi lansio arolwg heddiw, yn gofyn am ddatganiadau o ddiddordeb gan fusnesau lleol a allai fod â diddordeb mewn llogi safleoedd mewn lleoliadau amlwg yn y brifddinas gan gynnwys Parc Bute, Gerddi Sophia a Bae Caerdydd.

Dywedodd yr Aelod Cabinet dros Ddiwylliant a Hamdden, y Cynghorydd Peter Bradbury: "Wrth i'r cyfyngiadau cloi lacio rydym yn benderfynol o wneud popeth allwn ni i gefnogi'r economi leol ac, ar yr amod ei bod yn bosibl i'r busnesau weithredu'n ddiogel, yn unol â rheolau cyfredol y Coronafeirws, gallai hwn fod yn gyfle diddorol iawn i rai busnesau ailgychwyn neu ehangu eu cynnig."

Mae'r arolwg yn awgrymu y gallai fod gan fusnesau yn y sectorau iechyd, ffirwydd a chelfyddydau perfformio diddordeb arbennig yn y cyfle ond mae'n croesawu diddordeb gan fusnesau ym mhob rhan o'r economi ar yr amod bod y gweithgaredd yn unol â rheoliadau presennol Coronafeirws Llywodraeth Cymru neu newidiadau a gyhoeddwyd eisoes ac y gellir eu haddasu i amgylchedd awyr agored.
